



What we know about Functional Skills Entry level English



WHAT IS PHONICS?

"a method of teaching people to read by correlating sounds with symbols in an alphabetic writing system."

Phonemes – name for the sounds of letters or groups of letters

Graphemes – name for the written letters that represent the sounds

- /k/ scheme, occasion, cream ch, cc, c


