- Exposed to FE through high quality supported placements with our partner providers;
- Provided with a range of appropriate CPD;
- Equipped with a Level 3 Award in Education and Training.

For those participants who decide teaching is not for them, we will also work with you to help them into other vacant positions, or to explore other options such as apprenticeships or further study/training.

This is a fantastic opportunity to support local people into rewarding careers within the sector, or indeed beyond, whilst helping you to recruit talented individuals without any of the associated recruitment risks and costs.
