	<p>To process waste materials to give them new functions.</p>
	<p>Trade between companies in developed countries and producers in developing countries in which fair prices are paid to the producers.</p>
	<p>Periodic modification of Earth's climate brought about as a result of changes in the atmosphere as well as interactions between the atmosphere and various other geological, chemical, biological, and geographic factors within the ECO system.</p>

	<p>Energy that is not depleted when used such as wind or sunlight.</p>
	<p>Carbon footprint is a term that describes a persons, companies, or communities carbon emissions through their activity.</p>
