











Background and Strategic Fit



Purpose of the Multiply Scheme



Aimed at adults who do not have a Level 2 or equivalent in maths to improve adult functional numeracy levels.



The national aim is to increase the number of adults participating in and achieving numeracy qualifications up to and including Level 2 (both GCSE Grade C/4 or above, and Functional Skills).

In Greater Manchester, we are linking this to all essential life skills (English & Digital) where possible, so residents have a full rounded offer



Activity will be complementary and **different** to existing Adult Education Budget (AEB) interventions & **does not displace or duplicate existing** adult numeracy provision.









What it means for Greater Manchester



GMCA's intention is to ensure the funding enables access to maths / numeracy skills for those who would not normally consider accessing the usual adults skills offer and that the funding complements and enhances the existing offer and increases participation.



Key to delivering Multiply across GM is to ensure it complements and works alongside other local and national programmes including the wider UKSPF offer.



Utilise the funding to target residents who would not normally engage in the existing offer and ensure the funding works harder to engage more residents and progress them on to other services and support.



Key to GM is a targeted approach both geographically and to key groups of residents.



Devolved Adult Education funding can be used to enhance the Multiply Scheme funding to provide a full essential life skills offer, i.e. not just maths, to include English and ICT skills and complement existing ESOL activities.



Core service objectives




- ✓ To provide numeracy and maths skills support to residents across GM, in particular those hardest to reach and/or who have no or low qualifications.
- ✓ To ensure GM residents are fully supported in engaging with Multiply, GMCA wants to ensure all residents are offered the opportunity to obtain further skills relating to maths/numeracy by offering a clear action progression plan.
- ✓ Residents should be supported to explore the full offer to encourage them to try another course, or workshop, which could inspire the residents to enroll on a more formal course and achieve a maths/numeracy qualification.
- ✓ The support should incorporate a relevant level of assessment of residents' maths needs as well as signposting them to a wider maths/numeracy offer.



70% of the overall contract will be targeted to areas that will benefit the most










Enhanced Level 2



What is it?

せ For those at risk of not achieving their Level 2 Maths qualification. Providers were able to suggest projects to support learners Support was ringfenced to current **AEB** providers delivering Level 2 Maths. 13x providers are taking part, supporting c.1200 learners

G Multiply will cover the cos cover the costs associated with offering additional support e.g. tutoring to enable learners to achieve their level 2 maths










Some examples of support offered



Additional tutoring sessions tailored to subjects learners may need extra help with. This could be study sessions or 1-1 support



Test and learn pilot – trialling an app which allows learners to access tailored tutoring at their own pace and in their own time – particularly good for learners with outside responsibilities



Counselling support for to support learners with stress and anxiety, particularly around exams, especially post Covid



Additional support with equipment e.g. calculators to enable learners to study independently

What we're looking for	Why?
VCSE, Third Sector, Housing Associations etc are able to bid to the Managing Agent for up to £100k to deliver projects to support residents furthest away to achieve their skills & employment goals	 We want this funding to go to organisations working with our most hard to reach residents Feedback we have received from VCSE partners noted that increased funding per project (from £20k) would be beneficial to support longer term planning and outcomes
The Managing Agent will be required to support VCSE/Smaller organisations to be able to bid for project funding	 Feedback we have received from VCSE partners noted the strong support received in previous schemes really benefitted them, residents and enabled them to access funding
These will be outreach and/or engagement activities to support residents to progress them	This is to enable our hardest to reach residents or those with barriers the opportunity to access provision available across GM
GMCA ESW team will work with the managing agent & key stakeholders on where projects should be targeted on an ongoing basis	 This is to ensure the support gets to those who really need it and where they need it, as well as responding to emerging needs To ensure all boroughs get an equitable share for their residents









Commissioning to come

Targeted support to be developed for offender groups and care leavers



This Multiply offer will be delivered in 2 parts

- a. Adding capacity to current Local Authority Leaving Care Teams
- b. Multiply Skills Offer

Offender Groups

This Multiply offer will be designed and tailored to meet the needs of offenders (including ex-offenders) in Greater Manchester. We are currently exploring options to ensure this opportunity gets to those who need it.

Work with and develop an Employer based offer



- 1. Courses for parents wanting to support children with their homework (Key stage 1, 2 and 3)
- 2. Courses for adults wishing to progress within their careers, but maths/numeracy is an issue
- 3. Courses designed with employers to support sectors struggling to recruit, because maths/numeracy is an issue
- 4. Courses to support Apprentices undertaking Level 2 Functional Skills Maths, but at risk of not achieving
